

Pupil Premium Funding 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is additional funding allocated to pupils who:

- are entitled to Free School Meals (FSM)
- have been eligible for Free School Meals at any point in the last six years (Ever 6)
- are looked after children (LAC)
- have been adopted from care (post LAC)
- are from a Services family

From the strategies and interventions, we will implement we would expect that eligible pupils will:

- Improve their level of attainment and progress individually, against their peers and against national averages.
- Have full access to the curriculum
- Have a noticeably enhanced level of resilience for the next stage of their education

How will the school spend the 2019/20 allocation to achieve its objectives?

The pupil premium we expect to receive for our financial year 2019 to 2020 will be calculated using the information from our School Census (January 2018 – 27 eligible pupils) and we expect to receive £35000.

This year plans are in place to:

- Provide intervention activities & specialist support in Reading, Writing and Maths & dedicated attainment tracking.
- Provide resources for all support and intervention groups.
- Work in partnership with specialist agencies to provide emotional and social support.
- Work with The Learning Foundation to support those with little or no access to the internet
- Support parental engagement.
- Fund trips, visits, extra-curricular clubs and activities for all Pupil Premium children and in addition swimming lessons for Year 2 PPG children.
- Offer milk daily to all Pupil Premium Children.
- Offer support in providing school uniform.
