We even planted our own beans. We were excited to watch them grow!




Year 1










In Maths we have started exploring how to group objects. We have also been doubling numbers within 20, please help us practise this at home too!


In English, we have written a fantastic new adventure for

Year 3


We loved our visit to Kew Gardens to learn about the variety of plants and how they pollinate. It also linked in with our learning about biomes.

Year 4 have had a super sunny and engaging half term! Here's a snippet of our Summer 1 learning:



In Science we have been learning all about living things and their habitats; we learnt about animal classification and the different types of habitats there are in the world, our local area and even in our school! We went on a habitat hunt around the playground, the pond area and the wildlife area to see what micro-habitats and creatures we could find!

In PE we have been taking part in either swimming, cricket or athletics! We have built on our existing knowledge and have been developing our skills!







In Geography we have learned about rainforests. We researched the different layers and what might live in each one.




In Art we have been focusing on photography; we looked at how angles and light can change the way a photo looks and we tried manipulating light using everyday objects.


year 6



Our **English** text this half-term has been David Almond's **Skellig**. We have used this to explore motifs and imagery, as well as to inspire our writing, including some powerful poetry!



In other areas of the curriculum we have studied the circulatory system and international trade, thinking about how everything links up inside our bodies and in the world around us!



In the penultimate week of Summer 1, Year 6 had their **SATS** and we were all truly impressed by how hard they worked towards them. Results will come out in the children's end of year reports, so in the meantime we busied ourselves with a massive Golden Certificate in Friday's assembly and a picnic lunch up at Meadway, followed by an extra-long and well-deserved Golden Time. Each class has since had a **circle time** to discuss how to get the most out of the final half-term and all the wonderful things planned for them.





We learnt that instruments can be played in different ways to create different sounds

In Music this half term Reception have learnt a selection of songs about plants and minibeasts and have been developing their rhythm skills by playing claves along to the music.

Y1 have been developing their vocal skills and singing different songs about how plants grow. We then matched different percussion instruments to the different parts of the song.

In Y2 we have been developing our understanding of pitch and looking at how this helps us to perform on different instruments. We have started to learn to play the keyboard and are using iPads to help us.

This term Year 3 have been learning about pitch. They sang a simple round about the rain and re-wrote it using their own lyrics! They enjoyed Garage Band and playing stringed instruments. They even recorded their own voices, looping them to create fun effects.


Year 5


