







Y2 book donations





























GUEST CATERGORY: GRAPHIC NOVELS

We visited Hounslow Mosque where the Imam told us about the building, and how it is used. He also told us about some Muslim beliefs and highlighted some of the similarities with Christianity and Judaism.

We also made a visit to the Science Museum. Children explored the Wonderlab Interactive Exhibition, which had activities related to electricity, magnetism, forces and light. We also explored some other exhibitions including Space and Medicine.

Our trip to the Twickenham apiary helped us understand the lifecycle of bees and how important they are for all living things. We even got to hold a drone (a male bee with no stinger).



Year 5 had a wonderful trip to Marble Hill House and Park, where we found out about Henrietta Howard - the remarkable woman who built Marble Hill House in the 18th century.





YEAR 6 It has been such a busy final half-term! To get us in the mood for writing non-

chronological reports about birds, we went birdwatching along the Crane River and produced some amazing art as well. We went to the Orange Tree Theatre to see *Hamlet* and chose our PTA books from The Alligator's Mouth. We made bread in D&T. 
Summer 2 Sports Round-Up

This half-terms sporting highlights included our Girls Tag Rugby team (middle right) going unbeaten at the Harlequins tag rugby festival on The Stoop pitch. We also had Year 6 teams represent us at both the Richmond Tennis Championships and the Richmond Hockey Championships (top left) with brilliant performances being put in at both events. As is traditional at Trafalgar Junior School, we also took part in the All-England Gaelic Football Championships (top right) with no less than 65 children making their way to London Irish in Sunbury to take part in the championships on a very wet and windy day! Summer 2 also saw Trafalgar trying to defend two titles; firstly it was the KS2 Gymnastics trophy which our team (bottom right) bought back to Trafalgar once again. Miss Hunt said, "The team's dedication and passion for training saw us win the competition in amazing style in a close fought contest". Finally, Trafalgar headed to St Mary's University to defend the Borough Sports Athletics shield (top middle) against 39 other schools. An amazing performance saw us earn our second-best finish in the last 50 years with a well earnt 5th overall and 3rd place amongst large schools.











Along with 346 other schools, we participated in 'London Rocks' - the London wide Times Tables challenge. Well done to all who participated. 5AJ, 5R and 3P were the top 3 scoring classes, and the most valuable players were Milan, Teddy and James, all from class 3P!


