We have enjoyed learning about Christmas and took part in the Christmas bazaar where we thought carefully about which gifts to buy for our loved ones.




In science we have been learning all about reflective materials and deciding which one would be best to make a reflector out of.

We have been learning about how light is important to different cultures and religions.






In English, we have been reading some amazing books! Our favourite book this half term has been 'Look Up'. We did lots of writing and wrote a diary entry all about Rockets day.











In History we have been learning about significant people from the past as part of our 'Light' topic. 





The Year 3 staff are so proud of each and every child for how hard they have worked this half-term. We have been very busy!

In Year 4 we've had a half term full of great learning and fun experiences! We looked at the text 'Cloud Busting' by Malorie Blackman, applied map reading skills in Geography, we explored column method and built on our timetables in Maths and we presented our amazing creative projects!



We also had our brass instrument performance to family and friends where we showed off our musical skills with trumpets, trombones, cornets & baritone horns!
















In D&T this half term we have been designing and creating wire loop games! We used what we learnt in Science last half term about electrical circuits and worked in small groups to create our own!

In Science this half term we have been studying states of matter. We took part in a fun experiment which involved using scales to weigh a carbonated drink before shaking it, opening it (ahh!) and then weighing it again afterwards! This helped us discover whether gas has mass.

SOUPER SOUP!

This half term, Year 5 has been immersed in soup! We started off by researching a range of different soups from around the world; their origins, ingredients and whether they should be served hot or cold. We worked in groups to record our findings before reporting back to the class.

Our next lesson saw us taste-testing a mixture of soups, describing them in terms of taste, texture and aroma. We then went on to rank them. Across the year group, the Broccoli and Stilton soup was universally disliked, and the Thai Green Chicken Soup was a firm favourite. This would inform our decisions on which soups to make later in the term. Other lessons included learning about seasonality and the impact of importing food, from across the world, on the environment. After working in our design teams to choose our recipes, it was time to create our masterpieces. With the help of parents and other adults in school, each group brought their recipes to life. From Thai Green Chicken Noodle Soup to Hearty Pasta Soup, the individual design teams created some delicious outcomes. Finally, we evaluated our products, and the process, and created adverts to celebrate our soups and our achievements.



ENGLISH

Alongside our soup making, we have been learning about the adventures of Earnest Shackleton in our English lessons. We have written job applications, hoping to become a member of crew on **Endurance**, and diary entries about our experiences. We have also written letters and a description of Antartica. The children have read real diary entries and seen original photos and film footage, taken by Frank Hurley-the expedition photographer.

OTHER CURRICULUM AREAS

It has been an exciting and busy term, across the curriculum in Year 5. In our religion lessons, we have been learning about the work of different charities including Christian Aid, Islamic Relief, Children in Need and Fairtrade. Whilst in geography, we have learnt about volcanoes and earthquakes. During our science lessons, we have been investigating which materials make the best thermal insulators and in PSHE (Personal, Social, Health and Education), we have been learning about identity and discrimination. During our PE (Physical Education) lessons we have enjoyed learning new football, hockey and rugby skills, and practising these. In our maths lessons, fractions have been our focus throughout this half term.



Science: We have been learning about how light travels and making our own periscopes to prove it. We have also used our science knowledge and skills to plan and carry out our own investigations, shown our results on a line graph and written conclusions to show our findings. Phew!



English – The Invention of Hugo Cabret



D&T – Drawstring Bags


Having researched different types of drawstring bags, the children designed and made their own before evaluating the end product. We think you'll agree, there are some pretty cool designs...

Autumn 2 Sports Round-Up!

It has been a busy half-term of sporting fixtures and events for the Junior School this Autumn. We start with our Boys & Girls football teams who both attended the Richmond Borough Football Championships. The Girls team (Top Left) went on an incredible run that took them all the way to the Plate Final, which they sadly lost to TPA.

We also had success in Tag Rugby this half-term as we made it all the way to the final of the Richmond Rugby Club tournament. The event was played under floodlights before a first team game and after a narrow loss in the final to Heathfield the team got to be in the guard of honour for the RRC game.

Continuing our half-term of near misses was the Year 5&6 Basketball team who dominated on their way to the West Richmond final, the team went unbeaten on their way to the final with Jack scoring an amazing 56 points over 3 games! In heartbreaking fashion, the team fell just short in the final losing to TPA in a narrow 15-6 loss.

This half-term also saw Trafalgar enter the West London Table Tennis Team Championships for the first time ever with the winning school going on to attend the London Finals. The team (Middle Right) put in some amazing performances against some experienced schools from Richmond, Surrey & Merton.

Finally, we attended two athletics events this halfterm the Richmond Borough Cross Country Championships (Bottom Left) and the Waldegrave Area Indoor Athletics Finals. The latter of those events saw Trafalgar retain their title from the previous 2 years and become the local area Indoor Athletics Champions again! Which means we are off to the Borough Finals in the new year.
